A new 100 % DfE Funded free service that:

- facilitates the way in which schools can find skilled volunteers for their governing boards using an on-line, electronic, matching platform;
- provides new governors and trustees with induction, support and guidance.


Funded by the DfE and delivered by Education and Employers

Benefits from having 4 Regional Managers across the country.

In partnership with ASCL, NAHT and Academy Ambassadors.

Background to Inspiring Governance:

- The link between Education and Employers Taskforce and The Inspiring Governance Programme:
- EET Pioneered the creation of an online Platform 'Inspiring the Future' enabling individual schools to connect for free, to volunteers from the world of work to organise events within schools such as careers talks and carousels. 35,000 volunteers now registered.
- 2015-2016 discussion with the DfE around the potential use of the Platform and the skills within the charity of recruiting high calibre volunteers from the world of work, led to a 12 month pilot in conjunction with SGOSS; EET recruited the volunteers through the Platform, SGOSS placed them.






Drill down to an area and click on map point







- Ability to register indicating individual skills, preference for type of school,
- Support and advice to help new governors for the first year.
- Induction and training materials including fact sheets, top tips & specific guidance.
- Free access to the NGA's 8 e-learning induction modules.
- Dedicated support from the NGA via telephone and email.

Continued:

- Free Access to on-line resources, including Governing Matters.
- If aged under 40, membership of the NGA's Young Governors Network.
- Complimentary copy of the "Welcome to Governance" guide.
- And via Inspiring the Future platform easy way to volunteer an hour a year to talk to young people, help with CV, mock interviews etc.

Benefits for Employers:

- Effective way to support local community, meet CSR objectives and make a difference to education and the lives of young people.
- Helps build links with local schools, connecting with 80% of secondary schools and 3000 primary schools across the country.
- Helps develop staff skills including leadership, setting strategy and gives board level experience.
- Ability to target different groups of staff by gender, age, experience etc.
- Help available on how best to support staff serving as governors.

- Regional managers available to present to staff about volunteering in schools.
- Management information on their staff volunteering.
- And via Inspiring the Future platform easy way for staff to volunteer in schools eg talking to young people, career insights, CVs, mock interviews.
